MONDAY, APRIL 3, 2017 9:00 A.M.

The Board met in session at the Linn County Jean Oxley Public Service Center.
Present: Chairperson Oleson, Vice Chairperson Harris, Supervisors Rogers, Houser and Walker. Board members voting "AYE" unless otherwise noted.

Chairperson Oleson called the meeting to order.

Motion by Houser, seconded by Rogers to approve minutes of March 29, 2017 as printed.

Motion by Houser, seconded by Rogers to approve Proclamation: National County Government Month - April 2017

Motion by Houser, seconded by Rogers to approve Proclamation: Commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of Linn County Public Health.

Discussion: Pramod Dwivedi, Public Health Dir., stated that this is momentous in Linn County's history as Linn County took it over from the city of Cedar Rapids in 1967. They are also the only Health Dept. in the state that has achieved national accreditation.

CORRESPONDENCE: The Board received and placed on file the following correspondence: Thank you letters for county funding from The Academy for Scholastic & Personal Success, Cedar Valley Habitat for Humanity, Theatre Cedar Rapids, Best Buddies Iowa, Catherine McAuley Center, Junior Achievement, Community Health Free Clinic, Young Parents Network, Trees Forever, and Central City Senior Dining Program. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: Darrin Gage reported that the bill abolishing Compensation Boards and authorization passed down to the Supervisors has passed through the House. The county Mental Health bill goes to the Ways and Means Committee on Wednesday.

Supervisor Rogers gave further explanation of the Mental Health bill. Funds are capped at \$114 million statewide with an inflationary index built in. It removes individual county levy caps but does not change what the Regions can spend. Depending on what Johnson County does, Linn County's levy could go down \$1.
