
## Linn County Minimum Wage 2017-2019

 18,400 Linn County residents could benefit from a minimum wage increase

#### Who is a minimum wage earner?

- 54% Female/46% Male
- 52% full time
- 80 % of workers over the age of 20
- 87% High School education and above




### Linn County Minimum Wage 2017-2019

#### **Proposed increase date and rate:**

- January 1, 2017: \$8.25/hour \$17,160/year
- January 1, 2018: \$9.25/hour \$19,240/year
- January 1, 2019: \$10.25/hour \$21,320/year
- Assuming a minimum wage earner works 40 hours/week, every week, a \$1.00/hour increase is an additional \$80/pay check (pre-tax)
